It was lovely to see our new Kindergarten 2021 students at the Head Start sessions over the past few weeks. They really enjoyed their time at "big school" and meeting the teachers. We welcome our new 2021 Kindergarten students and their families to the Copacabana Public School community.

#### **Presentation Day Assembly**

This year our presentation day assembly will be held on Thursday, 10th December. Unfortunately, we are unable to invite family and community members to the event. Although Department of Education (DoE) regulations allow for end of year award ceremonies to be conducted, we must comply to all of the NSW Department of Health regulations regarding attendees including the 4 square metre rule. Neither our school hall or under the COLA have sufficient capacity to accommodate such an event. Student achievements will be acknowledged and celebrated across each stage cohort, Early Stage 1 and Stage 1 (K-2) and Stages 2 and 3 (3-6). More details will follow in regards to Presentation Day. Our Presentation Day assemblies will be livestreamed. The Brisbane Water Local Management Group of Principals have agreed to a consistent approach with presentation ceremonies across each school.

#### **Semester 2 Reports**

Teachers are finalising students' Semester 2 reports. Throughout the semester staff have worked together in Stage teams to develop common assessment tasks and marking scales to ensure consistency of student assessment. This is followed by the collation of this information along with the assessment evidence teachers have gathered throughout the first two terms about each students' progress. This information is then used to report to parents. Reports will be sent home to parents on Thursday, 10th December.

#### Planning for 2021 (Repeated Item)

Forming classes in schools is a complex process based on Department of Education staffing formula and guidelines. Decisions regarding class placements is taken very seriously with a variety of factors considered when placing students in classes. The school executive, in consultation with class teachers and support teachers take into consideration a child's academic, social and emotional needs when allocating students to classes. I am happy for parents to outline aspects of their child's learning and development that may need special consideration when forming class compositions. Please note that requests for specific teachers will not be met.

If you have additional information that you would like staff to consider when forming classes for 2021, it must be in writing to Stage Supervisors by Friday, 27th November through the school email - Copacabanap.schools@det.nsw.edu.au. Where possible teachers will consider your information, however there are many aspects to consider which may mean your wishes cannot always be accommodated.

## HELPING YOUR CHILD AT HOME - How You Can Help

Each fortnight we will include some tips for helping your child at home.

#### Being Ready for the End of the Year- How You Can Help.

The end of the year is a very special time with many celebratory activities scheduled. Both teachers and students eagerly await a well-deserved break. For some students, however, it can be a time of mixed feelings, sometimes including fear and anxiety. It is the perfect time to set your child up for a smooth transition from the end of one year leading to a great start for the following year.

As the end of year stresses begin to pile up, we must remember that an excess of caffeine, junk food and sugary drinks do not help children cope, nor parents cope with their children. Try hard to stick to the normal after-school routine. There tends to be more balls to juggle than usual which requires a commitment to maintaining routine and organisation.

School and the classroom culture can be an island of stability supporting a child's social and emotional needs. Some children may find the end of year frightening and guite stressful. Classrooms that nurture social-emotional growth and expression create a kind of belonging and when this comes to an end, students can feel an escalation of end-of-year stress.

Concerns may be vast, varied and personal. Some could be:

- What will my report say and how will my parents react?
- What if I do/don't get an award?
- Who will be my teacher next year?
- Who will be in my class and how will I make new friends?
- Will I feel good in my new class?
- How can I keep in touch with my old friends?
- Will I be accepted into my new class?
- Who can I trust and how will I know?



Children can start feeling uncomfortable and it may look like anger to an outsider. Children can have a powerful need for social contacts and the thought of leaving these close relationships can cause anxiety.

Strategies to lessen stress and ease the transition to the unknown could be helpful. Use a symbolic gift to help say so long for now. A talisman symbolizes ritual and ceremony, which our brains enjoy. A token such as a coin, stone, shell or a small hand-made object shared with another says that our relationship doesn't end – it simply changes. This could be a great resource for transition as students leave a class knowing that their friends will always be part of their journey even if they don't see each other daily. Use photos to send positive messages to friends that can be kept long after the end of the year.

Be sure your child knows you are proud of his or her accomplishments throughout the year and take the time to reflect. Give children specific praise for the skills they have improved upon and for their efforts during a unique year. A parent has the power to validate the feelings of their child in respect to both the difficulties and the upsides of the pandemic.



In this year of COVID, there have been and will continue to be, many changes. The end of the year is usually a time to showcase progress, celebrate accomplishments and reflect with classmates and teachers. For those receiving awards, no parents will be at the presentation assembly. Your child may need to be prepared beforehand to help him or her accept the new conditions.

Dopamine is a powerful chemical in the brain that brings feelings of satisfaction and increased motivation. Promote this chemical by setting your child up for the new year with a positive mindset. Talk about the positive side of having a new teacher and new class friends and the fabulous new challenges ahead.

#### **Athletics Carnival**

Last Wednesday Kindergarten and Year 1 students participated in a modified athletics carnival at school. The purpose of this carnival was to teach students the skills and techniques required to compete in the athletics carnival activities in coming years. The students had a great day and the teachers were so impressed by their efforts and the sportsmanship they displayed. True Copa spirit was shown as the children were cheering their friends on in the running races and helping each other during the activities. A special thank you to Miss Chapple and Miss Rose, who are currently completing their University Practicum with Mr Mensforth, for their help teaching the activities on the day and also to Mark, our school cleaner, for kindly donating ice blocks for all of our students to enjoy.

The canteen continues to offer lunch orders on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays with over-the-counter sales and frozen snacks on Fridays only. The menu has been expanded to include sandwiches, toasties and some additional healthy snacks.


