Selective High School Applications for 2024

Parents/Carers of children currently in Year 5 who are interested in applying for a position in a Selective High School are advised that applications are now open online and will close on 16 November 2022.

Key Dates:

- 16 November 2022 Application for entry in 2024 closes. Late applications will not be accepted.
- 20 April 2023 Test centre allocation and authority letter available to parents
- 4 May 2023 Selective High School Placement Test
- Mid-August 2023 Placement outcome expected to be released

Applications are completed online using the link Application Process. Parents must apply online at https://shsoc.eductaion.nsw.gov.au. Detailed information and instructions on how to apply online are available at: https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7. Please read the instructions carefully. Late applications will not be accepted. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on 4 May 2023. The test will be paper based.



COVID Update

Change to isolation requirements in schools

National Cabinet announced that from **Friday 14 October 2022** people who test positive to COVID-19 do not need to self-isolate. In line with this announcement, the following advice is based on recommendations from NSW Health and will support schools in adapting the change while minimising the risk of COVID-19 transmissions.

Students and staff should continue to stay home when sick.

Students, staff and visitors should only attend school when symptom free. We strongly encourage all students, staff and visitors to follow the guidance issued by NSW Health.

Schools will continue to send home students or staff displaying symptoms. Anyone who believes they have been exposed to COVID-19 is strongly recommended to monitor for symptoms and test if they have any concerns, as well as wear a mask.

The department will continue to make rapid antigen tests (RATs) available for students and staff who need to test for COVID-19. RAT testing may help identify the infection early and is important if you are in contact with people at greater risk of serious illness if exposed to COVID-19.

Moving out of the area?

As we move further into our planning phase for 2023, if you have a child at Copacabana who is NOT in Year 6 and will not be returning to Copacabana Public School next year, please let the school know as soon as possible. The number of students at our school affects the planning of classes, teachers and school programs, so the earlier we have information, the better.

Planning for 2023

Shortly, our teachers will be commencing the lengthy process of considering class groupings for 2023, taking into consideration number of students, gender balance (when possible), the placement of students with special needs, friendship groups and identified learning needs. Classes will be formed with a focus on achieving the best possible learning outcomes for students, informed by Department of Education staffing formula and guidelines.

If you have additional information that you would like staff to consider when forming classes for 2023, it must be in writing to Stage Supervisors (ES1/S1 – Mrs Walters, S2 Mrs Sutton and S3 Mrs Woodham) by <u>Friday, 11th November</u> through the school email- <u>Copacabana-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u>. Only correspondence via email will be formally considered – conversations with staff may be initiated but do not qualify as an official request. Where possible teachers will consider your information, however there are many aspects to consider which may mean your request **cannot** always be accommodated. Please note that requests for specific teachers will not be met.

Kindergarten Enrolments - 2023

We are now taking enrolments for Kindergarten in 2023. Children may be enrolled in Kindergarten at the beginning of the school year if they turn five years of age on or before 31 July in that year. By law, all children must be enrolled in school by their sixth birthday. If you are unsure if your child is ready to start school or would like to access further information, please contact the school via email

<u>Copacabana-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u> or phone 43821766. As part of the enrolment process, you will need to provide your child's original birth certificate, statement of complete immunisation from Medicare and proof of your current address (a minimum of 100 points of identification are required).



Tell Then from Me Feedback Survey

Our school will be participating in the Partners in Learning parent student survey, another part of the Tell Them from Me suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement. More information about the survey is available at:

The survey will typically take 5 - 10 minutes to complete and is entirely confidential. The student parent survey will be conducted in the coming weeks. Further information will be provided shortly.



Attendance

Every day your child attends school counts, as regular attendance helps students to:

- develop a sense of belonging
- develop and maintain friendships
- be more engaged at school
- progress with their learning
- be more aware of career and life options.



What happens if you wish to travel with your family?

Regular attendance at school is essential to assist students to maximise their potential. Schools in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students.

Families are encouraged to travel only during school holidays. If travel during the school term is necessary, discuss this with the school principal. An *Application for Extended Leave* is needed for absences of 10 school days or more. Parents seeking an *Application for Extended Leave* are required to provide all appropriate documentation and submit it to the school for consideration at least ten days prior to travel to enable appropriate processing time. Approval of any Application for Extended Leave is at the principal's discretion and parents are advised that their application may be declined. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

Please note it is important to restrict regular appointments to outside school hours this will ensure

- students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled in the day
- reduce classroom disruption
- ensure consistency and routine is maintained

News from the Office

School Travel - Term 4 2022



Applications for student travel in 2023 open from Monday 10 October 2022.

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2023 can apply now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should renew or update their details before the end of term 4. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications, and entitlements remain valid for the start of the 2023 school year. School Opal card holders will have the changes applied to their existing card.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade (i.e. grade two to grade three), the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, we will send an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition that is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply. Students in the Opal network applying for an Opal card (including a Term Bus Pass) for the first time will receive their Student Opal card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2023.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Travel from Term 1 2023

We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service/s to use and has a valid ticket to travel; either a School Opal card or Child/Youth Opal card (within Greater Sydney) or a School Travel Pass (outside Greater Sydney), from the start of the school year.

Applications for 2023 School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) travel open at the start of Term 4 2022, so parents/students can apply or update details early and be ready for the start of the new school year. Most students using the Opal network will not need a new Opal card and can continue travelling on their existing card each year. The start of the year is a busy period for local transport operators, and students travelling without a valid ticket make service planning and operations difficult. We recognise that for some families last minute changes to school enrolments mean they may not have a School Opal card or Travel Pass for the start of term. In the Opal network, we strongly encourage these families to have their children travel with a Child/ Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their local bus operator to discuss their travel needs.


Bus operators are flexible and understanding, particularly at the start of the school year, and will ensure students can travel safely to and from school. But to best support our operators we encourage all students to have a valid ticket, as early as possible, from the start of the school year.

Students using School Opal cards are also reminded that they must tap on and tap off in line with the **Student code of conduct** and **Opal terms of use**. Further information can be found at


