Student Enrolments

Thank you to the parents/carers who have advised us of their plans for 2023. It is very important that we have accurate information about our student numbers for 2023 to assist us in planning.

If you are having an extended holiday and your child **will** return in 2023, but not in the first two weeks of school, we need this information in writing for auditing purposes. This helps the school let the Department know the exact number of students who will be with us in 2023 to ensure we can make the correct number of classes (we can't count students in our numbers who are on holidays without written notice from parents indicating their return).

Classes 2023

Forming classes in schools is a complex process based on Department of Education staffing formula and guidelines. Decisions regarding class placements is taken very seriously with a variety of factors considered when placing students in classes. The school executive, in consultation with class teachers and support teachers take into consideration a child's academic, social and emotional needs when allocating students to classes. As we start to look forward to 2023 at CPS, we appreciate your ongoing support in valuing our dedicated and experienced teachers to use their educational expertise and professional knowledge to best place your child/ren into class groupings.

Attendance Matters

Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of students. Parents of children from Kindergarten to Year 12 must ensure their children attend school every day. On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g., attending a funeral.

Parents must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record.



Science & STEM News

It has been a fun year of Science and STEM learning in the Griffin and Computer Rooms. In the coming weeks we will be completing some Christmas themed STEM activities to finalise our Science and STEM learning for 2022.

Some students in Stage One have showed a keen interest in the Leafy Stick Insects that I acquired in April. They are growing and changing rapidly, with the students noticing changes each week when they visit. They are gentle insects and the students have enjoyed interacting with them and allowing them to crawl. Students have learnt to handle them softly ensuring not to damage their delicate leaf-like bodies.



Last Thursday 24th November was National Fairy Bread Day, a day to come together and have some fun and raise awareness for youth mental health. Some students in Stage Two during their Science lessons, discussed the significance of fairy bread and the science behind the delicious treat.
