#### Kindergarten 2023

We are now taking enrolments for all students who are eligible to start school in 2023 in our Kindergarten classes. Children may be enrolled in Kindergarten at the beginning of the school year if they turn five years of age on or before 31<sup>st</sup> July in that year. By law, all children must be enrolled in school by sixth birthday.

Online enrolment is now available.

#### **Classy Work**

One aspect of student learning is the writing of persuasive texts. These are texts which aim to show a writer's point of view and attempt to persuade the reader. One way we teach our students to do this is by showing them how to use high modality words. These are words which strongly convey the writer's attitude and point of view to the reader. These can include words such as unquestionably, arguably, definitely (instead of low modality words such as can, sometimes, perhaps). During the week, I had some students from 2R share their wonderful writing work with me. I was very impressed by the children's persuasive writing. Their writing provided a detailed account of their arguments, and the children used a variety of persuasive writing techniques.

#### **Everyday Maths Hub**

The NSW Department of Education has developed an Everyday Maths Hub, designed to assist in supporting parents and carers to engage with their child's mathematical development through fun, practical and creative activities called "Everyday maths". The webpage hosts a wide variety of topics from Kindergarten to Year 10, linked to the NSW mathematics syllabus used in all NSW public schools. Topics cover everything from number sense and algebra and measurement and geometry to statistics and probability. Resources for each topic include games, books, websites, puzzles, hands-on activities such as building with Lego, drawing maps etc and activities that parents and children can enjoy together. #### NCCD – National Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

Copacabana Public School is involved in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on school students with disability (NCCD), an annual collection that counts the number of school students receiving an adjustment due to disability and the level of adjustment that they are receiving. Each of the included students has been identified by the learning and support team as receiving a reasonable adjustment to address a disability under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992. For the purposes of the national data collection, students with learning difficulties or chronic health conditions that require monitoring and the provision of adjustments by the school may be included.

#### **Student Wellbeing**

#### Developing friendship skills

To develop good friendship skills, now and later, it is important children being developing the following skills:

- Welcoming: being able to approach and respond to others positively (e.g., with a smile and greeting such as "hello").
- Consideration: being able to say "please" and "thank you", taking turns, being able to lead and follow what others want to do, being able to cooperate and share.
- Play skills: being willing to take part in games and make suggestions for play.
- Communicating: talking and listening to others in a friendly way, saying something to start a conversation.
- Helping: being willing to help others.
- Prediction: being able to understand how other might be feeling based on their behaviour, being able to predict how their behaviour might affect others.
- Thinking: such as about alternatives when things go wrong (eg if other children want to play something, different, thinking of whether to join them or find someone else to play with.)
- Coping being able to respond to rejection, disappointment or disapproval without experiencing too much distress or winning without gloating.
- Empathy: being able to respond to others' feelings with understanding.
- Flexibility: being open to hearing or learning about other points of view or ways of doing things.

It takes a long time to learn these skills and we continue to develop them well into adulthood. We can help children develop these skills by being aware of what friendships and empathy skills they are developing, playing with them and giving some gentle coaching when children are really struggling with something. Children develop these skills though daily experiences; however, if parents are aware of them, they can give a hand at moments when help is needed. 














Please continue to donate any clean plastic caps to our plastic cap artwork. Our collection is growing but we still need more.


