Mathematics - This week's topic - Multiplication and Division	 Roll a dice twice and add both numbers together For an extra challenge, roll the dice three times and add the numbers together This week's topic - Multiplication and Division Watch this video about sharing objects equally https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=fgoUVDoHx5M Collect a range of objects that are different colours from around the house (e.g. different coloured lego bricks). Sort those objects into groups according to their colour. Do your groups all have the same amount in each group or different amounts? e.g. does your group of red objects have 3 and your group of yellow objects have 2? Can you find a way to make each group equal in number? Take a photo to upload to Seesaw. Complete the first worksheet 'Grouping and sharing - equal 	 Roll a dice twice. Put the bigger number in your head and take the smaller number away. What number are you left with? This week's topic - Multiplication and Division Read and solve the following number story. Marty is an octopus. He has 2 spots on each of his tentacles. How many spots does he have all together? Before you start, ask yourself how many legs does an octopus have? Re-enact the story with a parent or brother and sister. Pretend that there are only two of you to share the cookies with to start. How many cookies would each of you get? Repeat the process adding two more people each time the 'doorbell rings'. Don't forget to count how many people you have to share your cookies with each time and how many cookies each person 	 Star Jumps. Ask someone to call out a number from 1-10 and you call out its friend of 10 and do the same amount of star jumps. e.g. Mum shouts out 4, you shout out 6 and do 6 star jumps. This week's topic - Multiplication and Division Collect a range of objects from around the house. Up to 30 objects in total. What does sharing mean and how would you share your objects equally? Usually this activity is done in groups, so you can create your own group with teddy bears or other toys that you have. Repeat this activity with different numbers of objects to share between your group. You might even like to change the number of people/toys in your group.
