PDHPE Side Gallop Say to the students: Use light springing steps. Take off and land on the front of your foot. Make your body face forward. Keep eyes straight ahead (or look over your shoulder.) Step, close, step, closeor step, together, step, together, step, together. Use existing playground markings as tracks for side galloping. Students move along tracks or lines, looking in the direction of the track or looking in the same direction as their hips and body. Students side gallop in different directions, using the left and right foot to lead. Students develop side gallop patterns, changing direction, using a half turn, or using a different leading leg Get students to mirror a partner to develop the idea of using the side gallop to defend a player, as in basketball, netball or soccer.
